

UK HONEY LABELLING REGULATIONS

This is our advice on honey labelling, if you require more detailed information please go the Food Standards Agency.

- The word HONEY is required.
- The weight must be on the label.
- You can specify the area/county where the honey is produced, for example Gloucestershire Honey, Worcestershire Honey and Herefordshire Honey.
- You can specify if you want the type of honey. For example, Flower, Borage or Heather, the Honey must be at least 75% of that particular type.
- If you are selling honey you must have your name and address details on the label. It does not need to be complete but you must be able to be found from the information given.
- If you are selling the honey through a third party you must have a lot number/batch number.
- You must have a best before end date on the jar, we recommend 2-5 years from current date
- You must have a country of origin on the jar, for example, Produce of UK, Product of Scotland or Harvested in Wales.
ADDING THE COUNTRY TO THE END OF YOUR ADDRESS IS NOT ACCEPTABLE.

If you require lot number from L001 to L100 on each label then please specify on the special comments and delivery instruction box which is found on inputting your personal details when completing an order.
